# HOW IS IT DIFFERENT?

#### Normal Pace

Most people need about half the class time spent in review, practice and drill of new ideas and skills.



It's like learning to swim by wading in– developing skills strategically.

#### Accelerated Pace

Far less class time is spent in review, drill and practice of new ideas and skills.

It's like learning to swim by diving in– it works if you have some foundational skills before you hit the water!

#### Both methods create Great Swimmers!

## ACCELERATION PARADOX

Students with Gifted behaviors need time to process and assemble their thoughts. They have so many ideas, it takes time to sort them out, arrange them and construct them into new thinking.

To support our students, we structure our lessons to provide time to do this thinking... that's what we're doing instead of review, drill and practice.

Instead of repeating concepts, we structure lessons so students are assembling concepts themselves.

Same concepts-but more complexity.

This is much more mentally draining!

# FIRST EXPERIENCE WITH ACCELERATED COURSES



# AVOIDING THE PITFALL:

#### Support during Struggle



Even when you're growing, you

will still have setbacks.

Even if the parent does not promote competition in academics, students are comparing themselves to each other.

Resilience is coping with competition.

Focus on Growth.

Winning and losing are temporary.

How to take a loss without feeling like a loser.

What happens after failure is what is important.

# SUPPORT STRATEGIES

- Help keep things in perspective.
  "Of course you don't know it. That's why you're taking the class."
- Keep the thinking forward "What are your next steps?"
- Recognize the emotion.
   "That sounds uncomfortable (frustrating, difficult)."
- Don't alleviate the struggle.
  - "What would help you remember?" NOT "I'll remind you."
  - "You've got to get this done. How can I help you organize your time?"


#### MULTI-POTENTIALITY

## ENGLISH



#### All students take English in 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Academy.

- It is the foundation for reading, writing, listening and speaking necessary for success in all the other courses.
- Analysis and argument are the primary thinking skills for the class.
- Counts as 9<sup>th</sup> Grade English. High school credit is optional.

#### SCIENCE



Students take one semester Environmental Science & one semester of Conceptual Physics.

- Can be taken for high school science credit (optional).
- Prepares students for 9<sup>th</sup> grade Accelerated Biology (1 year Biology in 1 semester) and Accelerated Chemistry (1 year Chemistry in 1 semester)

## SOCIAL STUDIES

Students take Government and Current Issues.

- Can be taken for year of high school social studies credit including one semester of Gov't required for graduation.
- Prepares students for IB Diploma Programme.
- Learn to debate important local, state, national and international issues.




## MATHEMATICS



8<sup>th</sup> Grade students may take Algebra I or higher.

- Can earn high school credit for mathematics (optional).
- Opportunities to participate in mathematics competitions and earn cool prizes!
- Must take a mathematics placement exam before enrolling in classes.

# A WORD ABOUT 'CREDITS'



DMPS requires 23 credits to graduate high school.

If a student takes a full load of 8 courses each semester starting in 9<sup>th</sup> grade AND passes them, they will have 24 credits by the end of their Junior year.

Taking 8<sup>th</sup> grade courses for credit is OPTIONAL and should not be a priority in choosing your classes.

If you are gifted in mathematics, take it here at Academy.

# A DAY IN THE LIFE...

- Students attend classes at Central Academy for approximately half their day, beginning in the late morning.
- Busing is provided at no cost to families from the students' comprehensive schools.
- Some students eat lunch here, and others eat before they come.
- Students attend 2 classes on A-days and 2 classes on B-days
  3 of the classes are academic and 1 Directed Study
- At the end of the day, a bus will take students back to their comprehensive school in time for dismissal or to stay after school for extra-curricular activities.

- Students must maintain an A or B in courses which are considered pre-requisites for Academy classes (Mathematics, Science, English, Social Studies)
