

Credit options for AP classes that also earn DMACC credit – April 14, 2020

- **Withdraw both DMACC and AP. Deadline: April 30, 2020**
 - A. W on DMACC transcript
 - B. W on DMPS transcript
 - C. Does not count in GPA.
 - D. No credit for the class; neither DMPS or HS
 - E. IF the course is a prerequisite for another class, you will have to retake the current class before progressing to next class.
- **Stay enrolled in both DMACC and AP.**
 - A. Continue work on DMACC competencies and, if desired, improved past work with multiple opportunities.
 - B. Same grade for both credits: DMACC grade = HS grade
 - C. Students may choose P/NP AFTER semester close on May 20. Passing is awarded if the grade is C or higher. (Choosing P/NP = grade is not in GPA) Here is guidance from DMACC about P/NP on your DMACC transcript. [DMACC Pass Fail FAQ](#)
- **Withdraw from DMACC and take AP class for P/NP credit.**
 - A. W on DMACC transcript
 - B. DMPS credit on transcript (if P) but it is not a weighted and does NOT count in GPA.
 - C. Teacher submits P/NP when submitting semester grades for DMPS. Passing is awarded if the grade is D or higher.
- **Withdraw from DMACC and take AP class for letter grade. Deadline is April 30.**
 - A. W on DMACC transcript
 - B. Letter grade on DMPS transcript is weighted.
 - C. Students may improve letter grade through multiple opportunities on previous work/learning targets only.
 - D. Students may keep their current grade without doing multiple opportunities
 - E. Student can change their mind and get P/NP if life happens. They just notify their teacher. Teacher must submit semester grades (or P/NP) at the end of May, so if students change their mind about the letter grade, it must be by the end of May.
